

A Special Meeting of the Levin Borough Council was held in accordance with a resolution passed by the Council on the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1907, on Thursday evening the 5<sup>th</sup> July 1907.

All the members of the Council were present viz The Mayor (W. B. R. Gardner) Mr Douglas, Hall, Hankins, Anderson, Levy, Mackenzie, Pouse Ryder & Williams.

The Clerk intimated that the Meeting was duly summoned to consider the report of the Roads Committee which recommended that the Council take steps to raise a loan of £3000 from the Government if possible extended over a period of two years, the purpose <sup>of the loan</sup> to be street and footpath construction and improvement.

The Mayor moved & Mr Ryder seconded "That the Report of the Roads & Streets Committee be adopted."

An amendment was moved by Mr Anderson & seconded by Mr Mackenzie "That the report of the Streets Committee be referred back for modification as it is considered unnecessary & undesirable to spend £3000 on the streets of the Borough at present."

After a long discussion the amendment on being put was lost on the following division: Ayes (3) Anderson, Hall, Mackenzie; Noes (7) Douglas, Hankins, Ryder, Pouse, Levy, Williams & the Mayor.

The Mayor's motion was then carried on the same vote of 7 to 3.
